Summary

Belgium regularly reports hate crime data to ODIHR. ODIHR observes that Belgium has not reported on hate crimes separately from cases of hate speech and/or discrimination.

Official Data

Figures refer to crimes with a racist or xenophobic motive and include crimes of incitement to hatred and crimes of discrimination.
