ODIHR recognizes Mongolia's efforts to report hate crime information to ODIHR. However, based on the available information, it observes that Mongolia does not collect data and statistics on hate crime. In addition, ODIHR observes that Mongolia would benefit from raising awareness among and building the capacity of criminal justice officials to address hate crime.

National Developments

In January 2023, the government of Mongolia presented a draft bill on the 'Protection of the rights of citizens' on social media' and the parliament passed the law two days later, on 20 January 2023. There was widespread concern in the public regarding the potential applications of the law. As a result, the provisions were vetoed by parliament
