Summary

Turkmenistan has not submitted information on hate crime to ODIHR since 2008.

ODIHR's Key Observation

ODIHR observes that Turkmenistan has not reported data and information on hate crime to ODIHR since 2008. ODIHR observes that Turkmenistan has not nominated a National Point of Contact on hate crimes. In addition, ODIHR observes that Turkmenistan would benefit from raising awareness among and building the capacity of criminal justice officials to address hate crime.

All incidents submitted by the above organizations have been analysed by ODIHR. Those that are broadly considered to be hate crimes within the OSCE definition (criminal offence committed with a bias motive) are listed in the tables below according to the bias motivation category. Some incidents involved multiple biases and may be listed in multiple categories.

ODIHR's insights

In 2024, ODIHR received a report of one anti-Christian incident that took place in Turkmenistan. ODIHR did not receive any reporting on Turkmenistan relating to racist and xenophobic, anti-Roma, anti-Semitic, anti-Muslim anti-LGBTI, gender-based or disability hate incidents. This indicates potential gaps in the information reported here.

Consequently, ODIHR observes that there is a lack of reporting from civil society on Turkmenistan.

Please note that incidents reported here are based on voluntary civil society submissions and as such do not reflect the actual number of incidents or the most targeted communities in Turkmenistan.
