

Changes in data display

What are we changing?

In order to make full use of the information you are providing ODIHR with, we will begin displaying short descriptions of the incidents when the 2016 data is published. These descriptions will complement aggregated numbers and display information by country, bias motivation and type of crime.

What will we collect?

We will continue to collect the same information about hate incidents across the OSCE region. The details include:

- Date of the incident;
- Country and location of the incident;
- Type of crime;
- Description of incident;
- Information about the victim's background and gender;
- Information about the perpetrator (such as whether an attack was carried out by a group);
- The bias motivation for the incident, as well as indicators that explain why this is a hate crime.

What will we present?

Not all of the information we collect will be displayed publicly. The information to be displayed will include:

- Month and year the incident took place;
- Country in which the incident took place;
- Victim's gender;
- Victim's nationality or background;
- Description of the incident;
- Name of the reporting organization.

ODIHR will not display the name of victims, or information that could lead to identifying the victims in any of the cases.

Anonymity guarantees

Please notify us if you do not want ODIHR to include the name of your organization as reporting specific incidents.

Where will the data which you submit to ODIHR be stored?

The information submitted to us will be hosted on ODIHR's local servers. The data will only be accessible by authorized users, who have to analyze or review the information. Access to the information will be password protected.
